


ABOUT THE COVER



We, at MGM Dental College and hospital believe in serving the humanity, with an effort to uplift the oral health of the population. The goal of the institute is to provide basic & advanced Health promotion to an individual and community. This is achieved by rendering oral health care with multi-disciplinary approach to weaker sections of society which primarily includes rural areas, urban slums and inaccessible areas of Thane and Raigad District. This has been accomplished through peripheral satellite centers and well equipped Mobile Dental Van. Creating awareness on oral hygiene and prevention and treatment of dental diseases is done through dental camps. This year 19089 individuals have been screened and educated for oral hygiene while 352 patients have been treated by reaching them in rural and tribal areas. The institute has also organized oral health check up camps and education programmes in various schools in order to make the young minds more informed about the importance of oral hygiene practices. Keeping in mind the needs of our elders, oral health check up camps were organized for senior citizens. MGM looks forward to extend the efforts and serve each and every individual with a vision of health for all.


On behalf of the entire editorial team I am proud to dedicate this new endeavour to our college and hope to see it evolve and grow in the years to come.

Awareness should be spread that sexuality is not just a choice but also a genetic trait. One should be free to make this choice just like other things, and accept others. Sexual orientation and gender identity are integral aspects of our selves and should never lead to discrimination or abuse. No one should be denied of employment, medical attention or accommodation based on their gender.

What the LGBT community really needs right now, is a strong support system to back them up. Both, the feminist and LGBTQ rights movements aim at combating similar mindsets, the patriarchy. LGBTQ people too, often become victims of misogynistic behavior. Their ultimate goal is equality, be it for gender or sexuality, both important civil rights issues that are deeply intertwined. Transgender women today are often not seen as being real women because they were biologically born a male. However, these are the women who are most prone to discrimination and hateful rhetoric. These are the women that feminism should be fighting and protecting.

The LGBTQ+ community as well as feminists encourage the same thing, to stray away from the gender norms if you so choose to. Gay men who express themselves in a feminine way are targeted more when compared to the one's who are more masculine. This is another reason why the two communities should work together. They both fight for people to be able to live their lives and express themselves in any way that they choose without discrimination. If the feminism activists welcome and encourage this minority to stand along them, they will together provide a great deal of knowledge while producing a great impact.

NEPAL AND ME

I was a freshly passed out post graduate student in 2016 when I came across the job opportunity in Nepal for working as a Lecturer in Public Health Dentistry. Little did I know that this would be one of the most beautiful as well as challenging phases of my career. Before I could understand the magnitude of my work, I had landed in the mesmerizing landscape of Nepal, in the midst of Himalayan snow capped mountains.

Our hospital's mission was to provide quality care to the locals of Nepal, especially those who lived in remote and inaccessible areas. It was a community based hospital and had a separate community department program whose sole aim was to "Reach the Unreached". In collaboration with them we organized a few dental camps in remote areas.

One of the incidents that left an indelible impression on my mind was the camp we organized in Malkot, in Kalikot district of Karnal. It took us three days of travel by road on a very treacherous terrain and 6-7 hours of trekking to reach the camp site. There were hardly any healthcare facilities in the vicinity of our campsite. The people there warmly welcomed the entire team of medical and dental specialists. They kept us in their homes and fed us with whatever food was available with them at such a high altitude. They made sure the "doctors ki toli", as they named us, had no problems and we were kept as comfortable as possible. Throughout my stay of 3 days there was no electrical supply in the area and we could only perform dental procedures like extractions for the patients who complained of toothache.

The patients poured in from all the nearby villages on the mountains. They were elated to receive healthcare by specialists from gynaecology, ENT and General Medicine. On examination, the team discovered that many children had nutritional deficiencies, due to less protein in their diets. Majority of the people had very little idea about the various methods of contraception and the importance of family planning. Their dental hygiene and attitude towards availing dental care was poor.

It was then that I realized the importance of food. Even the little amount that we throw away could actually be a meal for some hungry child. Since then my perspective towards life changed. I have learnt the value of things and realized how easily we take whatever we have for granted. If we pause for just a minute and look at how blessed we are to be able to live comfortably and afford such things, we might be a little more at peace with ourselves. And inner peace – is it not what we strive for? From the depths of my heart I would always be grateful to Nepal, for it has taught me that in reality "Experience is the best teacher."

But who knew that the future would be, a group of challenges, who thought easy it would be. It started with dizziness and vomiting and loosing of consciousness just like it happens when you are in pain and 2 shots high..!!

But this time it was different, because she wasn't high and nor drunk. It was a sign that a new life has sowed a seed in her. Soon this sign was confirmed by the various tests available handy to confirm. It was happiness all around the corners until the day of regret hit. Soon after a few months the sonography test declared that it was a baby girl and not a baby boy. This realisation killed the high spirits of the family but not of the mother. Days passed by with discrimination and curses by she didn't lose her strength. She kept on fighting and standing up for her girl who wasn't even aware of all the things going in the world outside. Even the society didn't let her live as it was a shame in their eyes to have a girl as a child. Arrived the day when her labour started and was taken to the hospital. A new journey was waiting for her and her new soul which was going to build up her strength again which was drained by the criticism of people. It was not a normal delivery, she had to undergo a C-section to get the child in her arms. But soon after the delivery the mother realised that her baby was taken away from her by the in-laws in order to maintain their hype in the society. The child was sent away from the mother who was strangled alone in hospital realising that the reason for her life was gone even before she could see her.

These kind of happenings were faced by many women earlier and are faced even today. Some of them are threatened to death while babies after coming to life are disowned. A major role is being played by society which is encouraging this abuse. But with education, somewhere control is established but not eradicated. Small villages still follow this sex discrimination which needs to stop to restore the value for women.

INGREDIENTS (1 CUP = 250 ML)

- 1 cup moong dal
- 2 to 3 cups water for soaking
- ½ cup oats
- ¼ cup water, for grinding or add as required
- ¼ teaspoon turmeric powder
- ¼ teaspoon red chili powder
- ½ teaspoon roasted cumin powder or cumin powder

- 1 pinch hing
- ¼ cup chopped coriander leaves
- ¼ cup finely chopped onions
- 1 teaspoon grated or finely chopped ginger
- 1 to 2 green chilies finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon salt or add as required
- 1 to 2 tablespoon oil for cooking pancakes add as required.

PREPARATION:

- The batter in a bowl. add ¼ teaspoon turmeric powder, ¼ teaspoon red chili powder, ½ teaspoon roasted cumin powder, oats and 1 teaspoon salt or as required.
- Mix very well.
- Then add add ¼ cup coriander leaves, ¼ cup finely chopped onion, 1 teaspoon grated ginger, finely chopped green chilies and a pinch of hing.
- Again mix very well.
- Allow the batter to rest for 15 -20 mins.
- The onions will leave some moisture. check the consistency of the batter. if its too thick, then add 1 to 2 table spoons more water. adding too much water will not be good as it will not spread evenly on the non stick pan.
- The consistency of the batter has to be of pouring consistency, neither too thick nor too thin.
- Heat the pan. this is important as the pan has to be hot before you make the pancakes.
- Add a scoopful of batter towards the center of the pan.
- · The batter will spread a little on its own.
- Just rotate the batter with the back of spatula giving a round and even shape.
- Drizzle few drops of oil around the edges of the pancakes
- Cook the chillas on medium heat. after a minute they will look crisp and brown.
- Flip the pancake and cook the other side for a minute.
- Once the pancake appear crisp and brown, remove and place aside
- Similarly make all other pancakes . you can stuff the pancake with some grated paneer if you want.
- Serve moong dal pancakes with tomato ketchup or green chutney.

OATS KHEER

INGREDIENTS (1 CUP = 250 ML)

- 1 tablespoon ghee
- ½ cup quick cooking oats
- 3 cups milk
- ½ cup sugar or add as per taste
- ¼ teaspoon cardamom powder
- 1 pinch saffron strands optional
- 3 to 4 almonds chopped (optional)
- 3 to 4 pistachios chopped (optional)
- 6 to 7 cashews chopped (optional)
- 1 tablespoon golden raisins(raisins) chopped (optional)

PREPARATION:

- chop all the dry fruits, keep all the ingredients ready for the oats kheer recipe.
- heat 1 tablespoon of ghee in a thick bottomed pan.
- add ½ cup oats.
- stir well and saute for 2 to 3 mins on low flame.
- then add 3 cups of milk. add 1/3 cup sugar. mix well.
- simmer oats kheer for 2 to 3 minutes on a low flame, till the oats soften.
- add chopped dry fruits, raisins, pinch of saffron strands and 1/4 teaspoon of cardamom powder.
- simmer for 2 minutes more and switch off the flame.
- don't boil the oats kheer too much else it will become a thick kheer, when the oats kheer cools
 down then it will thicken more.
- serve oats kheer warm or chilled as a breakfast or dessert post meals.
