

What is Oral Health?

According to the WHO, Oral health is a state of being free from chronic mouth and facial pain, oral and throat cancer, oral sores, birth defects such as cleft lip and palate, periodontal (gum) disease, tooth decay and tooth loss, and other diseases and disorders that affect the oral cavity.

Risk factors

unhealthy diet, tobacco use, alcohol use, and poor oral hygiene.

PROPER ORAL HYGIENE.


Proper oral hygiene can prevent tooth loss, periodontal disease and tooth decay.

- · Regular Dental checkups


Know the tooth

We had explained the different parts of tooth in detail related to dental trauma.




• Causes of dental trauma

What could be the different causes of Dental trauma, so we had explained about the cause of dental trauma.




\square Types of dental trauma


On different level there are different fractures of tooth can be seen like only enamel fracture, enamel and dentine fracture, fracture involving pulp, or complete removal of tooth from socket.



Awareness about storage media

In a study we have found that only 2.4% of teachers know about the storage media. So had talked on interesting storage media in which we can carry the tooth to reach dentist as soon as possible.





• Management

So after as we receiving the tooth (in proper media) what procedures dentist carry out to treat the tooth had been explained in detailed.

WHAT DO WE DO WITH THE TOOTH?



Pre treatment:

Treat the tooth with doxycycline+ dexamethasone for 20 min.

Treatment:

- Stop the bleeding
- · Anaesthetize the area
- · Check for any fracture fragments in tooth socket
- · Clean the tooth socket with saline
- Replantation
- Splinting
- Appoint after 2 weeks
- If tooth is vital, then we appoint the patient for x-ray at 10th day and later at 1,3,6 month then yearly
- If tooth becomes non-vital, then we proced RCT and appoint the patient at 1,3,6 month and then yearly

As we all focus on the main injuries and avoid drastic injury like tetanus so we have explained about tetanus complications and management of it.

TETANUS

Tetanus is an acute infectious disease caused by toxigenic strains of the bacterium Clostridium tetani (C. tetani).


-Also called as 'lockjaw'

METHODS OF TRANSMISSION:


Tetanus may follow burns, deep puncture wounds, ear or dental infections, animal bites, abortion.
